

*Guidelines for the final examination of the Faculty of Humanities*

Although the paper may explore in further depth themes already addressed by candidates during the course of their studies, it may not reproduce works or parts of works already submitted in written form to a commission (three-year or master's thesis, end-of-year interview). Hence candidates must declare that their paper does not reproduce any parts of their three-year or master's thesis or end-of-year interview.

The paper is assessed for its originality and approved by the supervisor prior to its admission to discussion on the part of the Faculty Council.

The paper must be submitted in written form. Its length must correspond roughly to that of a scientific article of the Humanities area (from thirty thousand to eighty thousand key strokes approximately).

The guidelines are applicable starting from the academic year 2021/2022, hence for all students who completed their fifth year on 31 October 2021 and who apply for the final examination for one of the sessions established by the Faculty Council.

From December of the year in which the students complete their fifth year, the secretarial office begins to receive the applications from those involved, sending a notification and the application form.
