Title	Philological research on Italian texts, manuscripts and novels with digital applications.
Brief description of the research project	Both scholarships will be aimed at training a student capable of tackling the study of the Italian and Romance textual tradition in the new context of the digital transition. In fact, the training project intends to allow the challenge of digitization to be faced in a crucial sector of humanistic research in Italy and in Europe: the comparison with the culture of the past, in particular with the literary culture in the vernacular, and the possibility of reading it critically and making it significant for the contemporary also through new technologies. An integrated preparation is therefore foreseen, between philological method and IT instrumentation, capable of ferrying the great Italian philological tradition in the new methodological and instrumental context imposed by digital change, in line with the provisions not only of the PNRR guidelines but also of the 2021-2027 PNR, both in the field of protection of the manuscript and book heritage, understood as a vehicle of culture rather than as a material asset, and in the field of properly philological and textual research.

Period of study and research to be carried out abroad	It is mandatory to carry out periods of study and research in companies or research centers from a minimum of six (6) months to a maximum of twelve (12) months, even if not continuous, and periods of study and research abroad, even if not continuous, from a minimum of six (6) months to a maximum of twelve (12), according to the art. 7, Ministerial Decree 118/2023. The destinations for each student will be decided by supervisors and the Ph.D. course board.
