project	fact, the training project intends to allow the challenge of digitization to be faced in a
	crucial sector of humanistic research in Italy and in Europe: the comparison with the
	culture of the past, in particular with the literary culture in the vernacular, and the
	possibility of reading it critically and making it significant for the contemporary also
	through new technologies. An integrated preparation is therefore foreseen, between
	philological method and IT instrumentation, capable of ferrying the great Italian
	philological tradition in the new methodological and instrumental context imposed by digital change, in line with the provisions not only of the PNRR guidelines but also of
	the 2021-2027 PNR, both in the field of protection of the manuscript and book heritage,
	understood as a vehicle of culture rather than as a material asset, and in the field of
	properly philological and textual research.
